Betty Vaughn – Indiana Eta Chapter Member (Submitted by the Daughter and Little Sister of Betty Vaughn)



Betty Vaughn signed her contract to join Delta Theta Chi on December 6, 1944. At 97 years old she has been active for over 76 years. She reactivated the Indiana Eta chapter. Following are excerpts from many of the Founders' Day programs she has given over the years: "I was Betty Yost when I went to a rush party for Indiana Theta on October 17, 1944 at the home of Lola Lovell. Lola later became the first National Executive Secretary Treasurer, Big Sister of my future Big Sister Betty Yendes (later Bendit). They would instill upon me a great interest in Delta Theta Chi. I signed my contract to pay \$50.00 to join Delta Theta Chi sorority with chapter dues at \$2.50. That was a pretty good sum those days as a loaf of bread cost about ten cents. I was elected to Indiana State Council Recording Secretary in 1950 where I had to read my Saturday notes on Sunday, and type using a stencil then run them off on a mimeograph. After I

moved to Elkhart during the winter of 1951, I remained active in the Mishawaka Theta chapter. I had heard there had been a chapter in Elkhart, so then I wrote to National and was given names of former Indiana Eta members. I wrote letters to them and put articles in the local newspaper stating I was looking for prospective members inviting them to small coffee meetings at Hotel Elkhart. On December 5, 1954, with our National President Rose Richards as the installing officer, Indiana Eta became a chapter again. I was awarded the Emerald Special Recognition Badge at the second National Convention after the national reorganization from National for my work. Our first yearbook was made using carbon paper with manual typewriters on card tables in my living room. Indiana Eta grew and from our chapter other chapters have been established. I am proud of Indiana Eta, and I have always enjoyed sorority. When I moved into a town where I knew no one, Delta Theta Chi became my way of meeting new people and has given me friendship and sisterly love all these years."

SPEAKING OF 100 YEARS!!!

Oklahoma Beta Chapter was chartered on May 13, 1943, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Since that time, 78 years, many things have happened that changed the course of history – both in the world and in Oklahoma Beta Chapter. Many fine young women became one with Beta Chapter, stayed a while, moved on or passed on. Some then cycled into becoming Life Members when their serving days were finished. There have been three National Presidents, three National Vice Presidents, five Taygeta Province Trustees and fourteen Taygeta Province Presidents in service from this Chapter. Many, many Sisters have contributed to the success of Delta Theta Chi by serving diligently on National Committees.

Through the various years of Ways and Means Projects such as selling Christmas cards, having bake sales, Garage Sales, Flower Sales, Poinsettia sales, Rummage Sales, etc. etc. etc., we have managed to award approximately \$78,000 in Scholarships, \$39,000 each to Civic and Literacy Projects plus personal donations to each, have donated close to \$27,300 to the Oklahoma Regional Food Bank and over \$10,000 to the Red Cross.

Books have been donated to various needy schools in the Metropolitan area totaling over 2,000 volumes, and the hours spent in reading to classes of children and mentoring to same is well over 5,000. A local school's new library was completely furnished by Oklahoma Beta donations, and additions are made to that collection every year. One year Oklahoma Beta won the Crystal Flame Award for its participation and support of the Oklahoma First Books Program through the Oklahoma State Library System, which is still participated in. Many hours were spent walking, running or just donating to the Susan B. Komen "race against cancer" drive each year in support of Breast Cancer Awareness. We've supplied our local YWCA Women's Shelter with approximately \$36,000 worth of toiletries and personal needs over the years.

Through the past Covid 19 year, we have continued to conduct business in an almost ordinary pattern due to the excellent leadership of Oklahoma Beta Chapter, and our appreciation is extended to those officers.

Our present membership is 21 active members and 2 Life Members, and the total years of membership among these Sisters is 527 years of service. And we're not even 100 years old yet! As DELTA THETA CHIS, we are extremely proud of the accomplishments of our organization and urge you to... "Hold High the Torch, you did not light it's glow ... 'twas given you by other hands, you know ... HOLD IT HIGH!!!" We've got another successful 100 years ahead of us!!!
